Prepare your heart and mind for worship on Sunday, May 12, 2024, each day this week, with the following passages and questions. (RTYB'24= Read Through Your Bible in 2024)

Monday, May 6 **Leviticus 16:1-22**

- One of the goats dies (vs. 15) and one lives (vs. 21-22).
- How do these very different outcomes both foreshadow the ministry of Jesus?
- RTYB'24 – Proverbs 10-12; and pray for Pastor Ike & Nancy today.

Tuesday, May 7 **Leviticus 16:23-34**

- For how many different entities does the high priest make atonement (Lev. 16:33)?
- RTYB'24 – Proverbs 13-15; pray for the Nathan Graham family today.

Wednesday, May 8 **Hebrews 9:1-18**

- How is Christ's ministry vastly different from the priests who had served before Him (Heb. 9:11-14)?
- RTYB'24 – Proverbs 16-8; pray for Bill and Dixie Greenfield today.

Thursday, May 9 **Hebrews 9:19-28**

- What is accomplished through sacrificial blood (vs. 22)?
- RTYB'24 – Proverbs 19-21; and pray for Atlee Hershberger today.

Friday, May 10 **Hebrews 10:1-25**

- Why are daily sacrifices no longer needed (vs. 10-12)?
- RTYB'24 – Proverbs 22-24; and pray for Brenda Hershman today.

Saturday, May 11 **Leviticus 23:26-32**

- What was the penalty for doing any work at all on the day of atonement (vs. 30-31)?
- RTYB'24 – Proverbs 25-27; and pray for Dennis & Mindy today.

Sunday, May 12 **Leviticus 25:1-22**

- The year of Jubilee was announced on the day of atonement.
- Why was that appropriate?
