PRESIDENT'S CORNER – PASTOR PETER PEER

Ah December, that wonderful time of year when we celebrate the coming of our blessed Savior into the world to provide eternal salvation for all those who will put their trust in Him! The world celebrates Christmas without ever understanding what it is really about. Yet, for the millions who do not know Christ, it is even still a very special holiday celebrated throughout the world. It is an amazing fact that the birth of one person born over 2,000 years ago should evoke such celebration year after year through centuries. They may speak of the joy of Christmas, the spirit of Christmas, the giving of Christmas, yet they know nothing of the One whose birth Christmas commemorates. There has never been another person whose birth has been so universally celebrated. For those of us who know Christ as our Savior and Lord, Christmas holds a special meaning though it is full of mystery. The wonderful mystery of the incarnation is beyond the ability of any man to comprehend. The apostle Paul reduces the incarnation to this “And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness:

God was manifest in the flesh,
justified in the Spirit,
seen of angels,
preached unto the Gentiles,
believed on in the world,
received up into glory.” 1 Timothy 3:16.

Several years ago at the Ohio College of Pastors' Christmas banquet, I gave an address called “Of Originals and Copies.” In that talk I contemplated the wonder of the incarnation. God, the original, made a copy of Himself when He created man “in His own image and likeness.” But when the copy became corrupted with sin, the original Himself became a copy that He, as a copy, might die in order to restore the copies to the original image and likeness in which they were created. Who can understand it? The immortal, eternal God clothed Himself in the garb of the human flesh of which he was the creator. The apostle Paul puts it more eloquently than I, “8 And being found in fashion as a man, He humbled Himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted Him, and given Him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.” Philippians 2:8-11. Augustine said, “He was created of a mother whom He created. He was carried by hands that He formed. He cried in the manger in wordless infancy. He, the Word, without whom all human eloquence is mute.” A quote from the Preacher's Homiletical Commentary on Luke says this, “All the Divine visits culminated when He came in the person of His Son to abide with men, to be their Redeemer, to establish a new righteousness, lift them into the freedom of a glad and willing obedience to the Divine will, and so to turn all their sorrows into joy.” Or, as Philip Brooks put it in 1868, “The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.” May you have a joyous Christmas and a blessed new year of pursuing a sweeter, more profound relationship with our loving Lord.
